

IUNAM meeting

Dr Nyambi gave a background of the Department, informing the ESAAG team that it is the second biggest faculty offering Honors in the Accounting school, management sciences, political and administration studies, economics and a business school. It graduates the highest number of students, has seventy staff members and boasts of approximately eight thousand students. It is a young university with eight faculties, 27000 students and four campuses.

The CEO also gave an ESAAG background, also introducing the API after which a number of questions arose, some of which were:

What the initiative is called, where does it sit in the structures, what role can the University play in the initiative. There were also questions as to how other countries are tuning into the initiative.

The University shared its concerns with respect to the OAG office not working with them when they have a number of courses to offer, these being a diploma in accounting tailor made for public sector personnel as well as public sector accounting and management courses. They also shared the concern on lack of books on public sector, with only 2 available. The question was posed as to how we can work together going forward? An MOU was suggested and ESAAG was to come up with a template.

Next steps were agreed as follows:

1. MOU
2. Explore learning opportunities with Kenya
3. Strengthen the relationships with Ministry of Labour, OAG, AGpps) and ICAN.
4. Draft API curriculum: check whether accessible or useable in Namibia
5. Keep ESAAG UNAM relationship alive and dynamic

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
